HPL Sound and Vibration Talk

As part of our HPL program The Gregg School welcomed Giacomo Squicciarini from the Institute of Sound and Vibration at Southampton University to give an introduction to the subject of sound and vibration.

The talk was interspersed with some fantastic demonstrations. Acoustic toys and musical instruments were used to demonstrate how vibrating objects generate sound and which can be 'felt'. A long slinky and a Chladni plate was used to show reflection and standing waves, and different wave lengths and frequencies.

For the grand finale (which encouraged gasps of 'wow' from the students) small polystyrene balls were levitated using ultrasonic sound. We are very grateful to Giacomo for his time and for the entertaining talk! Mrs Toward
